Lauren Miller is Vice President, Finance and Operations for Warner Home Video Europe, a division of Warner Brothers. With 2004 revenues estimated to approach \$1.3 billion, Warner Home Video Europe manages 11 country affiliates and 20 licensees.

Lauren has over 20 years experience in diverse industries, including technology/telecommunications, media, and consumer goods, primarily in the finance and business development function.

Prior to joining Warner, Lauren spent several years as CFO for two UK telecommunications start-ups with principal funding from Soros private equity: OnCue was formed to provide voice and data services to the UK small business market and Storm provided voice termination and data services to corporate clients. Prior to Storm and OnCue Telecommunications, Lauren was Vice President, Business Development at Levi Strauss & Co. in San Francisco. At Levi's, Lauren also held positions in global treasury and business planning where she raised over \$3.8 billion for a leveraged recapitalization. Before joining Levi's, Lauren spent several years as Director, Corporate Development, at AirTouch Communications, where she was charged with implementing worldwide wireless development strategy, closing transactions in excess of \$5 billion and the IPO of AirTouch. Lastly, Lauren was credit trained at the Chase Manhattan Bank and worked for several years in the investment bank in New York, where she was responsible for structured off-balance sheet and tax transactions.

Lauren began her career with the US Congress, working for the Office of Technology Assessment in the Communications and Information Technologies Program where she was involved in technology assessment and policy analyses for Congressional Committees on such subjects as intellectual property rights and electronic technologies as well as information policy.
